# COVID -19 Status Report

## VACCINATIONS

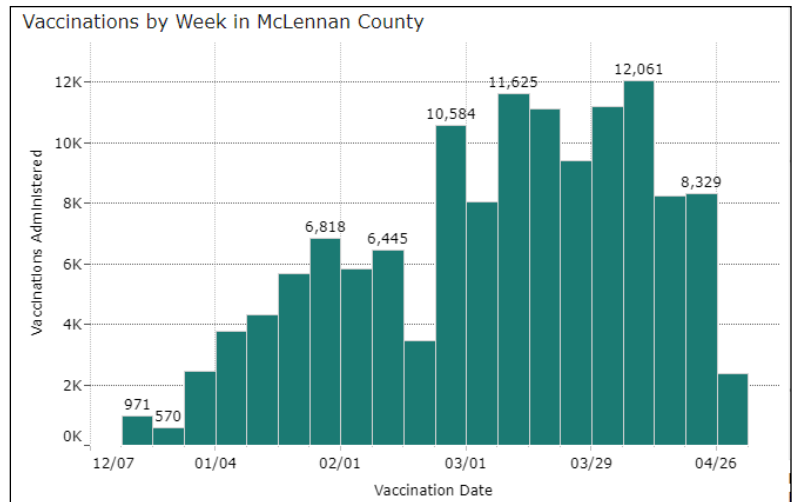

As of April 30, 2021, one in four people in McLennan County over the age of 18 years are fully vaccinated. 101 million (30.5% of total population), 7.6 million (34% of total population) in Texas, and 59,888(28.2% of total population) in McLennan County have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19.

As of April 26, 2021, the Health District has vaccinated 45,006 individuals. Of those, 57.1% were 18-64 years of age and 43.6% were 65 years and older. 16% were Hispanic, 65% were White, Non-Hispanic, and 10% were Black, Non-Hispanic.

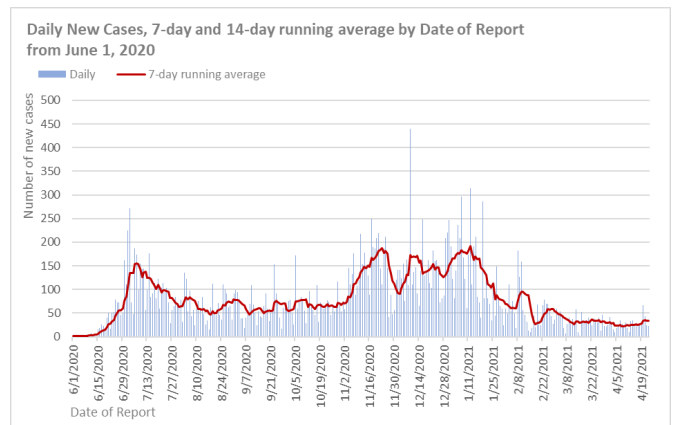

## REPORTED CASES

The current 7-day moving average of daily new cases (31.86) decreased by 5% compared with the previous 7-day moving average (33.57). Compared with the highest peak on January 11, 2021 (192.14), the current 7-day average decreased 83%. A total of 26,984 COVID-19 cases were reported as of April 30, 2021, including 40 new cases.

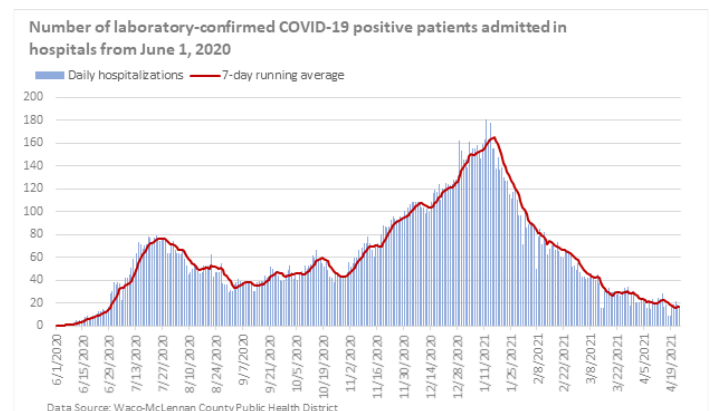


## HOSPITAL ADMISSIONS

Number of persons admitted in the hospital with a COVID-19 diagnosis has decreased by 2.6% in the past week. The 7-day average peak was 164.86 on January 16, 2021.

The current hospitalization rate for Texas is 9.25 per 100,000, while that for McLennan County is 7.4 per 100,000.



## SARS-CoV-2 VARIANTS

Based on specimens collected from March 28 to April 10, an estimated 59.2% of COVID-19 cases in the United States are caused by the SARS-CoV-2 variant B.1.1.7. As of April 30, 2021, Texas accounts for 59.2% of the total cases of the B.1.1.7 variant (*Commonly referred as the UK variant*) seen in the US. McLennan County currently has reported four B.1.1.7 and one P.1 variant cases.

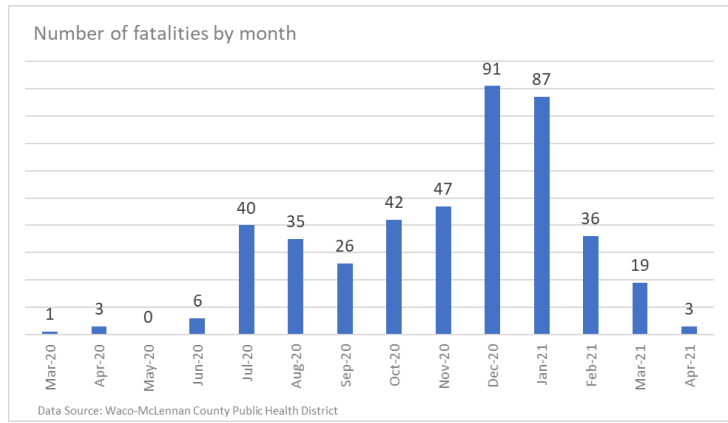
## FATALITIES

Overall, the deaths have decreased for 13 weeks. The current average of new deaths is 0 which is a 100% decrease from the highest peak (3.29) on January 23, 2021. This is extremely encouraging news and demonstrates the important role vaccinations plays in protecting against COVID-19. As of April 30, 2021, a total of 454 COVID-19 deaths have been reported in McLennan County.

The number of COVID-19 tests that come back positive (percent positivity) continues to decline. The 7-day average of percent positivity from all tests for McLennan County is now 5%.

The 7-day average test volume for April 23-29, 2021 was 258, which is a 10% decrease from the previous week.
